The Friends of Highland Recreation Area (FOHRA) is an all-volunteer organization comprised of residents, local user groups,

private businesses, and various resource organizations headquartered in Highland Township, Michigan. Under a lease

agreement with



the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, FOHRA supports the Highland Recreation Area and is working to bring the three remaining Edsel and Eleanor Ford Haven Hill Estate structures back to life, while returning them more closely to their original design.

Within one of the most picturesque, fascinating, and historically significant state



parks in southeast lower Michigan, the objectives of the Friends of Highland Recreation Area include combining the former Edsel and Eleanor Ford Haven Hill Estate history and structures with Highland State Recreation Area's

peaceful landscape, outdoor recreational opportunities, and other wonderful amenities.



The Haven Hill Estate

Edsel Ford (only son of Henry) and his wife Eleanor began purchasing parcels of land in Highland and

White Lake Township, Michigan in 1923. The plan was to construct a self-sufficient retreat as a diversion from

the hustle and bustle of city life. Edsel and his family enjoyed the country estate, which included a secure Gatehouse entrance, a 6,900 square-foot main Lodge on top of Haven Hill, a nearby Carriage

House for cars and drivers, a Farm Center building, Riding Stables, and a huge livestock Barn. Edsel passed away in 1943, and a few years later his wife Eleanor sold the estate to our state park system, which when combined with

other surrounding lands eventually became Highland State Recreation

Area.

Many alterations were made to the estate over the years to accommodate



various uses, but ultimately state budget cuts in the 1980's lead to closure of the structures. The buildings suffered from lack of use, but continue to fascinate visitors and serve as a popular park attraction. Unfortunately the original Riding Stables and Lodge were lost to fire, and the Barn was severely damaged by

a storm in 2008.



FOHRA members continue to rebuild and repurpose the remaining structures to preserve the history of Haven Hill for the future.
